Breakthrough is a seven-year, tuition-free academic accelerator for highly motivated, traditionally underserved middle schoolers in Philadelphia's public, charter, and parochial schools. Breakthrough nurtures a love of learning and helps Scholars reach top-choice high schools, setting the foundation for college/postsecondary and career success.

Breakthrough builds the next generation of diverse, talented teachers through its intensive teacher-in-residence program, designed to train and inspire college students to pursue careers in education.

LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

OCTOBER 2024

Dear Friends,

Fall is a time of excitement, reflection, and thoughtful planning here at Breakthrough! Now in my fourth year as Executive Director, I would like to take this season as an opportunity to celebrate the academic and personal growth of Breakthrough's Scholars and Teaching Fellows. I'd also like to wish our Alumni well as they embark on their exciting next chapters.



When Breakthrough students departed from GFS' campus last month, our staff and advisory board humbly reflected on the program and the impact it had on students and education in Philadelphia. We transformed these reflections into what we hope will result in stronger programming and operating plans to meet the evolving needs of the students and families we serve. We remain steadfast in our dual-mission to help Breakthrough Scholars reach top-choice high schools <u>and</u> build a diverse, talented teacher workforce. Inspired by our vision to reach educational equity and diversity, I am grateful to say that we are continuing to advance our dual-mission heading into our 30th anniversary year of programming in 2025.

This year, over 200 students participated in Breakthrough's tuition-free program, which has continually flourished since the pandemic. Building upon the high school admissions and preparation curriculum initiated in 2023, a joint Staff-Advisory Board committee launched another new initiative – College Bound. Nearly 20 Breakthrough Scholars enrolled and participated in four workshops, where they explored various careers, created resumes, practiced interviews, toured local colleges, and learned about financial planning and postsecondary options. Special thanks to our dedicated Advisory Board, Staff, and volunteers from Boston Consulting Group, RSM, Sanofi, Equitable Karr Barth Advisors, PHLY, Empower Construction, PA Youth Vote, The Defender Association of Philadelphia, Church & Dwight, and Montage Diversity Consultants, all of whom served as the backbone of this critical program.

With the launch of *College Bound*, Breakthrough now meets the needs of students beyond their middle school years and officially extends our program from a three-year to a <u>seven-year</u> academic accelerator serving highly motivated, high-need students in 6th through 12th grades – all at no cost to students and families.

Career Conversations, Community Connections, and local/<u>international field trips</u> remain pillars of Breakthrough's program. I am eager for Scholars and Teaching Fellows to dive into these enrichment opportunities, and I encourage you to engage in their experiences on Breakthrough's <u>website</u> and <u>social media channels – Instagram | Facebook | Twitter/X | TikTok | LinkedIn | YouTube</u>.

The Teaching Fellow (TF) portion of our program has also made good progress this year. In an effort to build the ranks of educators, the University of Pennsylvania's GSE recently announced that they will provide an annual \$20,000 scholarship for each Breakthrough of Greater Philadelphia TF Alum who enrolls in Penn GSE's Urban Teaching Program. We are thrilled about this partnership and vote of confidence in our TF Alumni. Our Summer 2024 program saw a record-level of returning TFs, with one-third of the TF cohort returning from 2023. 75% of Summer 2024's TFs were fellows of color, surpassing last year's record high. At the national level, Breakthrough recently reported that 75% of Teaching Fellows pursue careers in education, with over two-thirds of current teachers stating that they plan to teach for 5 or more years. I am hopeful seeing this data, which demonstrates Breakthrough TFs' long-term commitment to the teaching profession.

Breakthrough of Greater Philadelphia was incredibly fortunate to receive summer coverage from 6 different media outlets, including Ukee Washington (CBS News) and Nydia Han (6abc), who inspired our Teaching Fellows and Scholars with their personal experiences and words of wisdom. <u>Visit our website to see Breakthrough's summer media coverage</u>.

As we step into our 30th Anniversary year in 2025, my focus turns to the following goals:

Improve Scholar outcomes through comprehensive, end-to-end support from 6th through 12th grades. Per a recent survey, 83% of 8th grade Breakthrough Scholars attend a top three choice high school, with 100% attending non-neighborhood Philadelphia high schools. This upcoming fiscal year, we will extend our middle school program and build upon last year's College Bound pilot program to deliver a unique curriculum that meets the demands and rigor of high school, develops 21st century tech/digital skills, helps identify budding career interests, and provides

practical guidance for Scholars and their families as they prepare for postsecondary education (e.g., mock interviews, resume preparation, saving for education).

 Ensure Teaching Fellows are prepared

 professionally, personally, emotionally, and mentally – to enter the profession and consider placement for teaching jobs, especially in Philadelphia. We had a number of Teaching Fellows in the Summer 2024 cohort who were interested in the School District of Philadelphia, including one. Breakthrough Teaching Fellow who recently. shared with Chalkbeat about his experience growing up in Philadelphia public schools, and his goal to return as a teacher after he graduates from UPenn.
 We remain steadfast in our dual-mission to help Breakthrough Scholars reach topchoice high schools and build a diverse, talented teacher workforce.

- Find additional diversified funding sources to support Breakthrough's long-term sustainability heading into our 30th anniversary year. We are grateful for our Advisory Board, and the countless individuals, foundations, corporations who have supported Breakthrough as we continue to expand our program, reach, and impact.
- As we plug into the city, neighborhoods, and schools more intentionally, I will focus on strengthening community relationships and recruiting new members to our Advisory Board who can help us establish partnerships, identify sustainable funding, and enhance Breakthrough's programming in a meaningful way.

For the third consecutive year, we ended the '23/24 fiscal year in a solid financial position, with approximately \$1.4 million in revenue received to cover our expenses of \$1.2 million. BCG continues to generously lend their social impact, management and strategy expertise to help shape and implement our strategic plans and roadmap, in which Advisory Board, Committees and Staff have all taken active leadership roles.

Thank you for your continued confidence in Breakthrough's students, and for supporting our mission. As always, I invite you to visit the program, <u>get involved</u>, and provide your valuable support and ideas. I look forward to seeing you at the <u>Breakfast of Champions on October 24th at 8:15am</u>. Until then, enjoy reading this year's Impact Report and please join me in launching Breakthrough into a successful future.





PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS & UPDATES

Summer 2024 Program

Scholars and Teaching Fellows alike had a growth-filled summer at Breakthrough, with each day bringing invigorating and impactful experiences. 34 Teaching Fellows trained in a nineweek summer residency from June 10 to August 9th, where they taught 175 Breakthrough Scholars for six weeks.

Teaching Fellows served as lead teachers in the classroom and received daily professional development and training from Deans of Faculty, Ceora Wearing-Moore, and Matt Greenawalt, as well as from Instructional Coaches from the Philadelphia School District and Germantown Friends School (GFS). Brittani Davis, Gabrielle Goodman, Adam Hotek, Mack Hilton, and LaShundra McCook were our dedicated Instructional Coaches this summer. Stewart Calloway and Sue Chen served as our dynamic Deans of Students and provided tremendous support for Scholars and Fellows. In addition to their teaching roles in the classroom, Teaching Fellows had the opportunity to take on various leadership roles including committee chairs and grade leaders.

Scholars participated in four academic courses per day (math, science, history through writing, and literature) and electives such as crocheting, Bollywood dance, golf, ancient mythology, and gardening. Scholars engaged daily in Breakthrough's unique, high-energy community building activities like Spirit Checks and SLC cheers, which took place during All School Meeting (ASM) and Small Learning Community (SLC) time. Fridays focused on culture and community



building through fun field trips and other shared experiences. Scholars had a blast roller skating and enjoyed their adventures to the Philadelphia Zoo, Camden Aquarium, and The Academy of Natural Sciences. A huge thank you to Equitable Karr Barth Associates for volunteering to serve as chaperones for our field trips. We also continued our partnership with Walnut Hill Golf/First



Tee with Scholars participating in weekly golf lessons. Wacky Wednesdays and ASM provided another level of fun, where SLCs participated in games and other community building activities daily. We had a particularly spirited and healthy competition around earning "SLC points" with SLC's earning upwards of 5,000 points this summer!

Scholars enjoyed the interactive classroom lessons. Several guest speakers also shared about their careers and life experiences via our year-round Career Conversations series which took place on campus and during our field trips. (For a comprehensive list of speakers, see the "Guest Speaker" writeup later in this report). In-kind donors also kept our program interesting throughout the summer. We are grateful for in-kind donations from Frosted Fox Bakery, Famous 4th Street Cookie Company, Walnut Lane Golf Club, Equitable, and Cradles to Crayons.

Scholars concluded the summer program with Celebration Day on August 2nd. Students had the opportunity to participate in a fun-filled day created by the Arts and Celebration committee and hosted by our Teaching Fellows and enthusiastic volunteers from RSM US LLP. Scholars had the opportunity to showcase their work and talents gained during their elective coursework, and also had a full day of fun activities, including a giant water slide, karaoke, and plenty of delicious treats. Thank you to our amazing BTGP parents for their donations and support throughout the summer!

Launched in 2024... Breakthrough: College Bound

Earlier this year, a joint staff-advisory board committee designed a new pilot program for high school-aged Scholars called *Breakthrough: College Bound*. Nearly 20 high schoolers participated in the pilot program, which will roll out in earnest in 2024-2025. College Bound's mission is to prepare BTGP Scholars and their families to be successful in the college application process. We offered four Saturday workshops on the campus of Germantown Friends School:

- A Deep Dive into Career Conversations: Scholars had indepth conversations with professionals and learned about their educational and career journeys. They also participated in hands-on projects and discussions about careers in law, tech, healthcare, entrepreneurship, and business, among others.
 Special thanks to volunteers Francine Boone (ERM), William Bowie (Empower Construction), Sharene Ginyard (Defender Association of Philadelphia), Amala Ifediora (Church & Dwight), Dr. Claire Robinson (Private Practice, OB-GYN), and Fatir Woods (RSM US LLP).
- Resume Building and Interview Preparation: Whether Scholars were applying for summer jobs or preparing for college applications, a resume and/or interview is a required part of the process. At this workshop, Scholars heard from experts about the components of a successful resume and interview. They completed their own resumes, and ended the day with a round of mock interviews to hone their speaking and presentation skills. Special thanks to volunteers from Boston Consulting Group (Matt Smith, Sean Thaxter, Sandy Shen, Devu Nair, Mary Shiffer, Eryn Cohen), Sanofi (Poorna Ashok, Elizabeth Magner), RSM US LLP (Kristen B. Cummings and Rajdeep Singh), and Michael Thompson (Montage Diversity) for leading a high-impact, dynamic workshop!



- College 101 and Personal Finance: This workshop unpacked the college admissions process, led by Sue Chen, and also provided advice regarding financial planning from Matt Johnston and Brian Lake, Equitable Karr Barth. Topics included college affordability, loan types, applying for scholarships, loan forgiveness, and personal finance (budgeting, debt, etc.). We also covered commonly used college terminology, College Fair conduct, SAT/ACT vs. Test Optional schools, testing and application timelines. Scholars even participated in an admission committee simulation! Special thanks to Equitable Karr Barth and Breakthrough Alumna Kamryn Davis (PA Youth Vote) for sharing her journey from BTGP Scholar to college, and her current role as Philadelphia Regional Director, PA Youth Vote.
- College Tour at St. Joseph's University: Scholars met with current St. Joe's students, who
 gave them a bespoke campus tour. They also got a sneak peek of the Field House and
 experienced on-campus dining. Scholars learned about St. Joe's unique co-op program and
 various internship opportunities.



Community Connections

An essential goal of *Community Connections* is for Breakthrough to have a stronger presence at GFS, feel part of the school, and become integrated into the life of the community. In our over-scheduled lives, it is important for kids to be able to navigate and build relationships with younger/older students who may have had different lived experiences.

2023-24 was our third year of the *Community Connections* program, which included math, standardized test prep, literature and vocabulary building skills. Similar to last year, we focused on deepening the connections between GFS mentor-tutors and Breakthrough students through an hour of one-on-one tutoring, reading, writing, and discussion, followed by an hour of dinner, community-building games and activities. We hosted two trips in the Fall and Spring: Ice Skating at Dilworth Park and Tree Top Quest in Fairmount Park.

We are eager to welcome Breakthrough Scholars and GFS students back to class on September 18!



Guest Speakers: Career Conversations, High School Prep, College Bound

Breakthrough Scholars in Costa Rica

In Summer 2024, a group of Breakthrough Scholars attended Seeds of Change, a 10-day program in Costa Rica that encourages students to explore science (STEM) careers through immersive research experiences. <u>View trip videos/photos and read their expedition blog</u>, created by Monet Anderson. A snapshot of Scholars' schedules shows just how rigorous and exciting the trip was!

Day 2

Morning hike near the La Anita Rainforest Ranch, followed by a lesson on cacao (origins, types of cacao plants, tasting) and visit to Seeds of Change Research Lab high in the mountains of the Alajuela Province. End the day with a night hike to identify nocturnal organisms and observe different species of frogs, beetles and other insects.













Day 4

Scholars visited the ASOMECOLI Butterfly Research Lab and Garden to learn about different butterfly species. They formulated hypotheses about which area in their newly-formed ant colony would contain Escovopsis (a parasitic microfungus) and set up experiments to test their hypotheses. Students began formulating their group research proposals, and presented their project proposals in front of an audience.

Remarks from Breakthrough Visiting Day, July 2024

MY NAME IS DANIELLE TOLBERT and I am the mother of Aubrey Tolbert, a rising 8th grade Scholar. When Aubrey brought the Breakthrough program to my attention 2 years ago, I have to admit that I was a little apprehensive; not because of the workload that the program entails (because I know she could handle that), but because I knew her to be a bit shy and timid with a small circle of friends and classmates. But in watching Aubrey participate in this program, it has been fulfilling to see her growth throughout the years. It has actually pulled me out of my comfort zone as well (as I am not big on public speaking, but here I am).

As parents, we always want the best for our children. We dream about their futures, hoping they will seize every opportunity to grow, learn, and succeed. This program represents a crucial step in that journey. It's more than just a bridge between elementary, high school and college; it's a foundation for their future, equipping them with the skills, knowledge, and confidence they need to thrive.

Every day, I see Aubrey tackling new challenges, embracing unfamiliar subjects, and stepping out of her comfort zone. Watching her evolve, I am filled with immense pride. I see a young woman who is not just preparing for high school

Her eyes sparkle with the excitement of new discoveries, and her confidence grows with every task she completes.

We often worry about our children's readiness

by passionate educators, mentors, and peers who are all committed to her success. She is learning to navigate this new world with grace and determination.

This experience is not just about academic preparation. It's about personal growth. It's about seeing her develop a sense of responsibility and independence. It's about watching her build friendships that will support her through her school years and beyond. 


